BOOK REVIEW - God of all Things by Andrew Wilson


God of all things - Rediscovering the sacred in an everyday world by Andrew Wilson

Have you ever wondered why God made things? What do dust, donkeys and earthquakes have to tell us about God and about our own place in the world? As you cook, do you ever stop to think about how salt points to the people of God or how honey shows us the sweetness of God?

How can we think differently about the everyday (and not so everyday) things of life?

In short chapters, (each roughly 4 pages), Andrew Wilson looks at 30 created items, from bread to wind, via gardens, pots, viruses and more, using them to point us to God and from there to lead us into worship.



If you are looking for a book that will help you to be conscious of God's presence in the world as you go through your mundane daily tasks, this is the one for you. You will find yourself looking at the little (and big!) things around you differently. You will also learn a little more about how some of them are put together, causing you to wonder afresh at our amazing Creator God.

By reading just one chapter each day, you will have spent a wonderful month being equipped to see that all creation points to God and often in very unexpected ways! I am pretty certain that you will never look at your clothes in the same way again!
